This program is an interactive and hands-on demonstration program filled with dance, music, storytelling, and crafting. This fascinating adventure will help your students understand how the Hawaiian people observed their environment.

Visit a place where the beautiful and majestic islands of Hawai`i come alive. Your students will be introduced to Hawaiian artifacts, sweet island music, and the spirit of ALOHA. Your experience will include various themes surrounding the unique culture of Hawai`i and it's friendly people. Create a program that fits your classroom curriculum and schedule.

Choose Your Lesson

- **Ke Kino—The Body** \$5.00 per student
Students will learn how to identify parts of the body through song and dance using the Hawaiian language
- **Ka Niu—The Coconut** \$5.00 per student
Students will experience Hawaiian artifacts, coconut meat shaving, coconut eating and squeezing of coconut milk
- **Ke Kalo—The Taro Plant** \$5.00 per student
Students will be introduced to the staple food of the Native Hawaiian people and be treated to a Kalo preparation, cleaning, pounding and tasting demonstration
- **Ke Kapa—The Cloth** \$5.00 per student
Students will learn how Native Hawaiians made cloth while handling Kapa tools and learning a mele or song
- **Ka Wa`a—The Voyaging Canoe** \$5.00 per student
Students will be introduced to the mode of travel, a means of catching fish and a vehicle for the transport of food items, supplies and necessities for survival
- **Na Mea Hula—The Dance and Dance Implements** \$5.00 per student
Students will be introduced to an ancient form of movement that uses the body to tell a story and the use of different hula implements
- **Na Hulu Ali`i—The Royal Feathers**
Students will be introduced to the Hawaiian ruling families; the Kamehameha and Kalakaua Dynasties



Kui Kalo (pound taro) , is one of the fun activities that students are able to experience just as the Hawaiians in ancient times did.

Planning Your Experience

There are two (2) options when planning your cultural experience:

- 1) The team may visit your school or classroom, or
 - 2) You may visit our Hawaiian Cultural Center in the atmosphere of Aloha
- Select your location
 - Select a lesson that fits your school schedule and classroom curriculum
 - Make your reservations at least 2 months in advance
 - Have a minimum of 10 students
 - Bring the required chaperones
(for Center visit)
K-4: 1 adult for every 5 students
5-8: 1 adult for every 10 students
